# THE ROLE OF PGF

#### **ACTIVITIES**

Making the most of EU funds for Roma (MtM) is an initiative which seeks to connect achievement of Roma inclusion objectives to EU development resources. It was established in 2008 by the Open Society Foundations.

The goal of MTM is to align the obligations of the governments with the needs of Roma communities. In that way, it spans the Roma communities, local governments and structural funds of EU in comprehensive, complex and targeted intervention for including the Roma community in the society.



Project Generation Facility (PRF) is one component of MtM. The main PGF role is to help the potential beneficiaries of EU funds that have not enough human and financial resources as well as the experience in preparation of applications relevant for Roma communities. Trough assistance for preparation of project proposals, as well as trough trainings and advocacy, PGF seeks solutions for problems such as: insufficient representation of the priorities of Roma community on local level, lack of resources and experience of Roma community and the complex and bureaucratic procedures that if they are not familiar with, will block their access to EU funds. Roma inclusion in all project phases is the main element in this PGF intervention.

The goal of PGF is the contribution for improved and sustainable social cohesion of Roma trough providing equal opportunities for their involvements of using the funds.

- Technical support in the process of development the projects ideas for Roma inclusion into applications for EU and other funds
- Building the capacities of the civil society organizations that support or represent Roma, for preparation project for Roma inclusion
